

I've led young people day and night


And sacrificed to lead them right; But folks won't help me out a

UPDATE ON PASTOR GARY DICE'S ILLNESS

Pastor Gary Dice has been to the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota four times. He is now home and undergoing physical therapy at our local hospital in Pittsfield, Illinois. It is necessary for him to use a cane and oftentimes a wheelchair. He has 22 stents in his arteries and has been hospitalized thirty seven times, trying to recuperate from open-heart surgery in January, 2015. When he is able he still preaches at church and always does a tremendous job. He has had to change his lifestyle, and needs much more rest than usual. He still remains in charge of all services and events, and attends when possible.

INFORMATION ON GOSPEL TRACT MINISTRY

On April 11, 2004, Grace Baptist Church started their Tract Ministry through the Fellowship Tract League in Lebanon, Ohio. During this time we have been able to send out close to ELEVEN MILLION TRACTS into 151 countries. We have spent almost \$55,000 in this effort, plus sending \$150 per month to the tract league to help purchse, paper, ink and other supplies for printing the tracts. This has been a wonderful ministry for reaching souls worldwide. This does not involve the support we give monthly to almost 70 missionaries and mission endeavors around the world. We believe in the Great Commission of preaching the Gospel to every creature. The sun never sets on our ministry.

We might also add that we started the "Liberty Paper" at Grace Baptist Church on October 5, 2003. We provide it for our church and also send it to many missionaries, pastors, evancelists, friends and other people as a part of our missionary outreach. People write and tell me often that they use the Liberty Paper in preaching, in church bulletins, etc. Plans are to keep printing and sending this useful little paper that is a blessing to many.
