A weary soldier said, "PEACE is the most beautiful thing in the world and war the most ugly. Wherever you find peace, you find beauty."


Faith, Love, Peace! How can I paint them? thought the artist.

BE ALERT FOR MEDIA BIAS

Whether it is TV entertainment, Cable TV, movies, music, newspapers, magazines, educational institutions, think tanks, government bureaucracy, cultural movements and internet giants like Google and Facebook, they all promote the same secular liberal viewpoint ... a viewpoint that completely leaves God out of the picture and advances causes that are diametrically opposed to God's instructions. Be alert for these things as you listen and read:

- 1. Spin: Reporting one view only. Other views are excluded.
- <u>Editorializing:</u> Injecting personal opinions as fact.
 <u>Story Selection:</u> Emphasizing news reports that support one side of the issue.
- 4. Story Placement: Give prominent placement to their views and bury other views deep in the story.
- 5. Selection of Sources: Not a balanced, objective mix of sources and failing to identify sources.
- 6. Omission: Covering one side of the story and omitting other pertinemt views of information.
