

WHERE AND WHEN DID TIME START?

Here are some thoughts on time as gleaned from an article by Fred J. Meldau:

- 1. Time never moves backward. We never grow younger.
- Time stops for us when death overtakes us. Every day ends, every night ends, every year ends and every life ends.
- 3. Time is very short. Your time to repent of your sins and receive Christ as your Saviour is growing shorter.
- Time and material things will both pass away. Things down here are temporal. Your soul is eternal and will either go to Heaven or Hell depending on what you do with Christ.
- 5. Christians are admonished to "redeem the time." Time is short for Christian service. The Lord is coming soon. You will die, either in His will or out of His will. You have responsibility here and accountability there!
- God is above time. God made time for man, not for himself. God is eternal, having neither beginning or end.

Another thing I heard from a teacher in Bible College was this admonition: "A word to the wise is sufficient."

If a person is wise he or she will get saved and serve the Lord faithfully.

Time, as far as man is concerned, began when God created light (Genesis 1:3) and measured time by dividing light into periods of day and night. Genesis 1:5 - "And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and morning were the first day." Time is especially connected with the history of man. God made time for man's convenience and benefit.

Trying to understand time and eternity is beyond our human comprehension. When I was in Bible college I was taught that eternity was "infinite duration without beginning or end." I still don't understand it, let alone trying to explain it to others. Time and eternity is in God's hand and that is good enough for me!
