"A nagging problem for humans. . . . The interior of the Earth is tantalizingly close, by cosmic standards, but how do you get there?

"The deepest oil well penetrates a mere six miles into the crust (the center of the Earth is about 4,000 miles deeper). Russian scientists dug the deepest hole on the planet in Siberia, but bottomed out at about 7.5 miles below the surface.

"It gets harder and harder to drill deep into the earth because rocks get softer and softer. Brittle at the surface, rocks become plastic at depth, and the pressure caused by the weight of the overlaying crust—about 52,800 pounds per square inch at a depth of ten miles, says drilling consultant William Maurer—collapses deep wells, making further drilling impossible...

"It is hot down there, really hot— 9,932° F at the Earth's core according to scientists at University College London. (That's nearly as hot as the surface of the sun.) All that geothermal energy moving out through the mantle and crust can cause devastating earthquakes and volcanic eruptions."
