It was at this time he wrote the song, "Christmas Belle." The last verse revealed his heart. Here's the song:

I heard the bells on Criristmas Day Their old fanlliar carols play And wild and sweet the words repeat of peace on barth, good-will to men I thought how, as the day had cone The belfries of all Christendan . Had rolled along th' uribroken song of pence on earth, good-will to men.

And in despait I howed ry head: "There is no peace on earth;" I said.

*For hate is strong, and mocks the song of peace on earth, good-vill to men!" Then pealed the bells more loud and deop: EGod is not doad, noe doth He sleepy The Wrong ahall fail, the Right prevall, With peace on earth. good-will to men.
