 Just as the sun went down.

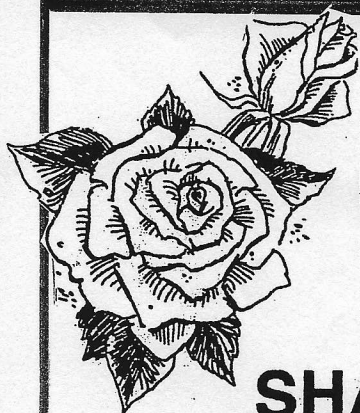
