> One congregation found that where and that includes active interest in the local congregation's programs, 93 percent of the kids remained faithful. On the other hand, if only one of the parents was faithful, that figure dropped to 73 percent. Where the parents were only what we would call reasonably active in the Lord's work, only 53 percent of the young people maintained their faith.

> Now here comes the shocker: In those cases where both parents attended only infrequently, the percentage of their children who remained faithful to the Lord dropped to 6 percent. Want your children to go to heaven? Then make certain you are leading them. That is the only way they are going to make it.

THE IMPORTANCE AND MEANING OF REPENTANCE

Repentance is the translation of a Greek word (metanoia—metanoeo) meaning "to have another mind," or "to change the mind," and is used in the New Testament to indicate a change of mind in respect of sin, of God, and of self.

This change of mind may, especially in the case of Christians who have fallen into sin, be preceded by sorrow,

(II Cor. 7:8-11), but sorrow for sin, though it may "work" repentance, is not repentance. The son in Matthew 21:28-29 illustrates true repentance. Saving faith (Heb. 11:39) includes and implies that change of mind which is called repentance.

WILL YOU FIGHT FOR RIGHT WHEN YOU CAN?
