

### Death Sentence Passed Upon Jesus Christ.

The following is a copy of the most memorable judicial sentence which has ever been pronounced in the annals of the world—namely, that of death against the Savior, the knowledge of which must be interesting in the highest degree to every Christian.

The sentence is engraved on a plate of brass in the Hebrew language, and on its sides are the following words:—"A similar plate has been sent to each tribe." It was discovered in the year 1280 in the city of Aquill (Aquilla.) in the kingdom of Naples, by a search made for the discovery of Roman antiquities, and remained there until it was found by the Commissaries of Art in the French army of Italy.

The sentence is word for word as follows:-

SENTENCE PRONOUNCED BY PONTIUS PILATE INTENDENT OF THE PROVINCE OF LOWER GALILEE. THAT JESUS OF NAZARETH SHALL SUFFER DEATE BY THE CROSS. IN THE SEVENTEENTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF THE EMPEROR TIBERIUS AND ON THE 25TH OF THE MONTH OF MARCH, IN THE MOST HOLY CITY OF JERUBALEM, DURING THE PONTIFICATE OF Annab and Caiaphab, Pontius Pilate, intend-ANT OF THE PROVINCE OF LOWER GALILEE, SITTING IN JUDGMENT IN THE PRESIDENTIAL SEAT OF THE PRETORS. SENTENCES JESUS CHRIST OF NAZABETE TO DE/TH ON A CROSS BETWEEN TWO ROBBERS, AS THE NUMEROUS AND NOTORIOUS TESTIMONIALS OF THE PEOPLE PROVE:-- 1. JESUS IS A MISLEADER. 2. HE HAS EXCITED THE PEOPLE TO SEDITION. 3. HE IS AN ENEMY TO THE LAWS. 4. HE CALLS HIMBELF THE SON OF GOD. 5. HE CALLS HIMSELF FALSELY THE KING OF IBRAEL. 6. HE WENT INTO THE TEMPLE FOLLOWED BY A MULTITUDE CARRYING PALMS IN THEIR BANDS. ORDERS:-THE FIRST CENTURION, QUINTUS CORNELIUS, TO BRING HIM TO THE PLACE OF EXECUTION, FORBIDS ALL PER-SONS. RICH OR POOR, TO PREVENT THE EXECUTION OF JESUS.


They borrowed a cave for Him a grave,
