
Later, the cold front of the knife will slice through the turkey and cause it to accumulate oneto-three inches on plates.


Cranberry sauce will create slippery spots on one side of the plate, mashed potatoes will drift to the other. Butter will spread across some sections.

By the President of the United States Washington, October 8, 1869

The year which is drawing to a close has been free from pestilence. Health has prevailed throughout the land. Abundant crops reward the labors of the husbandman. Commerce and manufactures have successfully prosecuted their peaceful paths.

The mines and forests have yielded liberally. The nation has increased in wealth and in strength. Peace has prevailed, and its blessings have advanced every interest of the people in every part of the Union. Harmony and fraternal intercourse, restored, are obliterating the marks of the past conflict and estrangement.

Burdens have been lightened, means increased. Civil and religious liberty are secured to every inhabitant of the land, whose soil is trod by none but freemen. It Westerner, Parker A. 1986.

Therefore 1, ULYSSES S. GRANT, President of the United States, do recommend that Thursday, the eighteenth day of November next, be observed as a day of Thanksgiving and of praise and of prayer to Almighty God, the Creator and the Ruler of the Universe.

And, second, I do further recommend to all the people of the United States to assemble on that day in their accustomed places of public worship, and to unite in the homage and praise due to the bountiful Father of all mercy, and in fervent prayer for the continuance of the merciful blessings He has vouchsafed to us as a people.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed, this the fifth day of October, A.D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and of the independence of the United States of America the ninety-fourth.
